April 2, 1867. Due notice of the annual Town meeting having been duly given, the legal voters met at the School House this day at 9 o'clock A.M. Polls duly opened. Ezekiel Ellsworth, C.W. Griggs and Henry Young, Supervisors were present and qualified and credited as Judges of the election. J.A. Sargent as Town Clerk, On motion, Lucius Warner was duly elected as a special Clerk for the day and was duly qualified.

On motion voted that T.D. Smith be chosen as Moderator of said meeting. Voted to elect 2 Pound Masters in said Town for the coming year. John Humple and Bernard Kohlholz were duly elected as Pound Masters. Voted that the Supervisors provide some suitable place as Pound for said Town. Voted to accept the report of the Town Clerk of said Town.

Voted to levy a tax of 8 mills on the taxable property of said Town for current town expenses to pay indebtedness for roads and bridges, Voted that the Town Supervisors be instructed to ascertain the expediency of dividing the Town into 2 instead of the 3 districts.

April 16, 1867. The Supervisors have this day assigned the following; as the road districts to wit;

First Dist. to comprise the Yorkville and St. Paul road, the Chanhassen and Smithtown roads and all middle of that part of Town plat of Chaska on the N side of Walnut street.

Second Dist. to comprise the Townsite of Chaska S of the middle of Walnut street and the Carver-Glencoe road and the Chaska-Waconia road to where the John Schmidt road intersects said road and also the Mill road to the ~~Territory~~ road.

Third Dist. comprise road from junction of Chaska-Waconia roads near the land of Andrew Foos to Town line near Michan Gansur, the old territory road, road passing John Smith house.

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April 7, 1868. Annual Town meeting. Meeting called to order by J.A. Sargent Town Clerk. On motion Ezekiel Ellsworth was chosen Moderator. In consequence of the absence of C.W. Griggs, one of The Town Supervisor, Ezekiel Ellsworth was duly elected as one of the Judges of the election. Henry Young and Mathias <sup>SCHMIDT</sup> were present. Henry E. Wolff qualified and was elected as assistant Clerk.

The election unaminously voted to levy a tax of 10 mills on all taxable property of the Town of Chaska for the year of 1868 for Township roads and bridges purposes for current year, and further voted that the Town Supervisors may issue Town Bonds in the sum of 500 dollars on a reasonable time if their judgment it is necessary for the purpose of constructing bridges in said Town.

April 28, 1870. At a meeting of the Supervisors of the Town of Chaska held the 28th day of April A.D. 1870 at the Court House there were present; Supervisor Florian Linenfelsler chairman, Thos Schuty and Henry Young. On motion Peter Weego was elected Clerk pro tem.

The following Resolution was adopted; Resolved that the Town of Chaska will issue its Bonds for the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (10,000.00) in aid of the construction of the Minnesota Western Rail Road. Said Bonds shall draw interest at the rate of Seven (7) per cent per annum, interest payable Semi Annually, principal and intrest payable in New York City, and principal payable in Twenty-five (25) years from the date of said bonds. One Half of said bonds to be issued and delivered to said Company when said Road is graded through the Town of Chaska, and the other Half when the Cars are running on said road through said Town.

Resolved that a special Town Election in the Town of Chaska be held on the 14th day of May A.D. 1870 for the purpose of voting on the above Resolution and that the Town Clerk be directed to post notices of said election as required by law and that the Election be held at the Public School House of School District no. 5.

Resolved that the Bonds will not be issued to said Company unless said Company comply with the following requirements; First to cross Walnut Street on First Street in the Village of Chaska. Second to locate their Depot within the limits of the Village of Chaska. The above Resolution adopted. Daniel Stone Town Clerk.

At a special Town meeting held in the Town of Chaska, County of Carver, State of Minnesota at the District School House in Chaska on the 14th day of May A.D. 1870. The meeting was called to order by Daniel Stone Town Clerk. On motion of M.H. Iltis, Ezekiel Ellsworth was duly chosen as Moderator of said meeting. The Moderator at the opening of the meeting stated the business as follows; to vote on Resolution to give the Minnesota Western Rail Road the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars in Bonds of said Town in aid of the construction of said Road. On motion of David Stone, Ezekiel Ellsworth was chosen as one of the Judges of Election in place of Henry Young who was absent. Proclamation was made by the Moderator of the opening of the Polls to receive votes and the Polls was then opened accordingly.

Number of persons voting were One Hundred and Forty Seven (147) The necessary to choice were Seventy Four (74) There were Seventy Four (74) Yess and Seventy Six (76) No, making it One Hundred and Fifty (150) on canvassing, it being found that Three (3) were cast bogus on spurious votes, the Election was declared Null and Void. On motion the meeting adjourned.

At a special Town meeting held in the Town of Chaska, County of Carver State of Minnesota at the District School House on the 31st day of May A.D. 1870. The meeting was called to order by David Stone Town Clerk. On motion of Florian Linenfelsler, Ezekiel Ellsworth was duly chosen Moderator of the meeting. The Moderator at the opening of the meeting stated the business to be transacted and the order of the same as follows; To vote for or against Resolution to give the Minnesota Western Rail Road Ten Thousand Dollars. Also for or against the proposed Liquidation of the Minnesota State Rail Road Bonds. On motion of David Stone, Ezekiel Ellsworth was duly chosen as one of the Judges of Election in place of Henry Young who was absent.

On motion it was voted to receive votes in at the window.

Votes cast upon Resolution to give the Minnesota Western Rail Road Ten Thousand Dollars was 171 for the Resolution, and 53 against, 118 majority against 65.

Liquidation of the Minnesota State Rail Road Bonds were 102 for, and 65 against, majority for 37.

March 12, 1872. At the annual town meeting held in the Town of Chaska, Carver County, Minnesota at the Public School House of the 12th day of March A.D. 1872. The meeting was called to order by Daniel Stone Town clerk. Lucius Warner was on motion of Henry Young duly chosen Moderator of the meeting. On motion Chas Moeschler was chosen as one of the judges of the election, and Theo Bitting as clerk, there being only 6 persons present at 10 o'clock, the moderator decided to hear the report of the Town clerk, and vote taxes and County. Report of Town clerk read and accepted, and the taxes were levied at 3 mills for road and bridges, and 5 mills for current expenses, also voted to let cattle and horses to run at large. Proclamation then made to open the Poll and preceded to vote for the Town officers, and the following gentlemen elected; Supervisors; P. Henk chairman, Frank Mieseler and Jacob Ebinger. Assessor; Chas Moeschler. Town clerk; Daniel Stone. Justice of the Peace; Peter Iltis. Constable; Nicholas Schoenborn. Overseers of the highway; Mathias Loglin, and Anton Boss. Pound Master; John Neunsinger.

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May 17, 1872. Meeting of the Board of Supervisors, all present; Philip Henk chairman, Jacob Ebinger and Frank Mieseler. On motion the care of Mrs. H. Mezer was taken up, and it was decided to consult with a Lawyer in the matter. On motion of Frank Mieseler, Nicholas Schoenborn was appointed as Constable in place of Frank Ess deceased. Motion made to adjourn without date, carried.

June 20. 1872. The Supervisors of the Town of Chaska met at 5 o'clock in the afternoon in a special session at the office of the said Town Clerk in the Town of Chaska. Present at the meeting were Philip Henk chairman, Jacob Ebinger and Frank Mieseler. The following Resolution was offered by Frank Mieseler one of the supervisors and unanimously adopted by said Board to Wit;

Resolved that we the Town Supervisors of the Town of Chaska in the County of Carver, State of Minnesota, issue the Bonds and obligation of said Township of Chaska in the sum and to the amount of Four Thousand and Five Hundred Dollars (4,500) . Said Bond and obligation to be payable in five years after the date thereof in the City of New York in the State of New York, and to bear interest at the rate of Seven per cent per Annum payable Semi Annually, and that said Bonds and obligation or the proceeds thereof shall be used and appropriated in the purchase or procurement of a Court House in said Township of Chaska for said County of Carver and for no other purpose.

The following Resolution was then offered by Jacob Ebinger one of the said Supervisors, and unanimously adopted by said board. Resolved that the resolution adopted by this Board at this meeting providing for the issuing of the bonds and obligation of said Township be submitted to the Electors of said Township of Chaska for their approval and adoption or repetition at an Election be held for that purpose which said election shall be held at the Public School House in the said Township of Chaska on the 8th day of July A.D. 1872.

The Polls of said election shall be opened on said day at nine o'clock in the forenoon and closed at 4 o'clock in the afternoon of same day of said Election shall be conducted in all respects as provided for in Chapter Forty-Eight of the Special Laws of the year A.D. 1871. On motion the board adjourned.

March 10, 1874. At the annual Town meeting of Mar. 10, 1874, Philip Henk, Mathias Smith and Theodore Bitting were chosen as Judges of the election, and Daniel Stone and H.H. Mead as Clerks, F.E. Du Toit was chosen as Chairman of the meeting and the following business transacted On motion by H.J. Peck to levy a tax of 10 mills for interest on the Court House Bonds, carried. On motion by Henry Young for a tax of 5 mills for Road and Bridges, and 3 mills for Town purpose, carried. On motion, Anton Hilton was elected as overseer of highways for District no. 1, and George Loney for District no. 2. On motion, G. Schubert was elected Pound Master, and the following by-laws were passed that Hogs, and Sheep be restricted from running at large, Mules and Horses be also restricted from running at large, Also that Oxen, Mules and Horses be restricted from running at large under the penalty of \$1.00 for each, and the fines to go to the Town funds, and the Supervisors shall furnish a Pound. Clerk, D. Stone. Supervisors, P. Henk chairman, F. Wolff and J. Ehrmantrou. Treasurer, Wm Brinkhaus. Assessor, Mathias Loglin and also as Constable.

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
