

Background Check Policy for the Chaska Historical Society

Felony:

If an applicant for a volunteer position has a conviction for any felonies they will be ineligible to be a volunteer.

Gross misdemeanor:

If an applicant for a volunteer position has a conviction for any gross misdemeanors they will be ineligible to be a volunteer.

Misdemeanors:

If an applicant for a volunteer position has multiple convictions (more than one) for any misdemeanors they will be ineligible to be a volunteer.

If an applicant for a volunteer position has been convicted of misdemeanor assault or theft they will be ineligible to be a volunteer.

If an applicant for a volunteer position has been convicted of more than one DWI they will be ineligible to be a volunteer.

If an applicant for a volunteer position has been convicted of one DWI the potential volunteer will be interviewed regarding the DWI in order to explain the circumstances surrounding the DWI conviction. After the interview a determination will be made regarding their volunteer eligibility status.

If an applicant for a volunteer position has been convicted of a misdemeanor and it is a victimless crime, such as failing have their driver's license on their person because it was left at home, they will be eligible to be a volunteer.

Petty Misdemeanors:

If an applicant for a volunteer position has more than three petty misdemeanors on their record accrued over the past five years they will be ineligible to be a volunteer.
